All of Isaiah chapter 50

### Discussion Questions

Question #1:

Do you feel that society is slowly becoming a 'blame culture' and that individuals are finding it harder to take ownership of their problems?

How do you see yourself in this regard when it comes to spiritual problems in your life?

Question #2:

**When Israel was taken into exile into Babylon it was devastating for the nation. They tried to put the blame on God but God intervened and said that it was because of their own sin that they found themselves in this state. (verse 1)**

**Ask yourself this question: Do you feel that God was unloving toward Israel by stating this? For what purpose do you think God said this to them?**

**Question #3:**

**Read verses 7 and 8 and ask yourself what you think God has in mind for you. How does He want to treat you even if He points out sin in your life? What is His ultimate motivation?**

**Then take some time to talk to Him about where you are at in life with Him right now. Tell Him your struggles. Listen to what He is speaking to you as you think about the words He wrote to you in Isaiah 50.**

**Invitation and Mission for this week**

**This week take some time daily to consider the things that are causing you grief, frustration or pain. Ask the Lord to show you if this is because of external influences, or if it has something to do with your own sin. It's not something that is exciting to do, and that makes it hard. But purpose yourself to seek after Jesus in this and you will be blessed.**
